ABOTA's Commitment to Civility and Judicial Independence

Among the primary tenants of ABOTA is a devotion to elevating the standards of integrity, honor, ethics, civility and courtesy in the legal profession. Through its Civility Matters program and a long history of responding to unfair attacks on judges who are ethically prohibited from responding to such attacks, ABOTA has promoted professionalism and judicial integrity. During the recent election season, public examples of civility have reached new lows and judicial

integrity has come under attack. Recent statements by presidential candidate Donald J. Trump, a litigant in a case pending before federal district court judge Gonzalo Curiel, questioning the judge's fairness and impartiality based upon his Mexican heritage are a recent example of the threat to an independent judiciary.

National ABOTA president Charles H. Baumbrger issued a strong statement in support of Judge Curiel. He noted that the judicial code of conduct and prevents jurists like judge Curiel from responding to such attacks. There is a legal mechanism to address complaints of conflict of interest and impartiality by seeking a recusal of a judge. Despite being represented by capable legal counsel, Mr. Trump has not sought recusal of Judge Curiel, demonstrating the political nature of Mr. Trump's public comments.

As attorneys and members of ABOTA, we are in a special position to be able to respond when unfair attacks on the judiciary occur. All of us have been on the wrong side of a judicial ruling at one time or another. Respect for the rule of law demands that we address our differences and disputes through appropriate channels. Whether through an appeal of an adverse decision or seeking recusal in those exceedingly unusual cases where actual bias exist, there are appropriate remedies for judicial bias, actual or perceived. Members of the public at large often do not have the benefit of the perspective of those who participate in the legal process on a daily basis. Attacks asserting bias based on the racial or ethnic background of a judge constitute a threat to the independence of the judiciary and the rule of law. It is our duty as lawyers to protect against such unfair criticism.


